Snake Produces 4 'Beans'

Dr. Morris Bader, a Moravian College chemistry professor, was intrigued recently when he discovered that while "ring-neck" snakes lay on their backs, they produce four "beans" from their bodies. He brought the reptile to the Karpman Park house in Bethlehem. At his home, the reptile soon became a family pet. Most mornings, the beans and the snake were taken to the park. When David's wife, Karen, explained that there were no jelly beans in the house, he determined that his pet had laid eggs. Acting on this suspicion, he watered the eggs daily to produce four natural babies. The first egg, however, was cracked when he watered it. The next day, the snake began to crack. The tiny baby snakes have wriggled free of their shells. The fourth egg, however, was broken by a road worm gnawed in the egg before it was laid. Bader is now searching for food material for the baby snakes. He was forced to release the baby snakes to the Bear Mountain State Park, because the snake was not eating anything.
