Ritter wants taxpayers to share Superfund cost

American consumers ultimately may pay the cost of an expanded federal program if U.S. Rep. Don Ritter succeeds in passing legislation to share Superfund costs with taxpayers.

Waste sites, not complicated by issues such as toxic liability, are the focus of Superfund. Ritter said he believes there may be enough money to pay for the program. He said he would like to see the program expanded to include hazardous waste sites.

Ritter said he doesn't think \$5 billion is enough. He believes a more realistic amount would be \$10 billion, to be approved by Congress for the next five years of the program.

Ritter indicated \$15 billion is unrealistic. He complained that some who advocate such a program are "not on chemicals" and "not on the political side."
