Liberty team places first in state math competition

The Liberty High School team placed first in the 14th Professor John Steiner Gold Mathematical Competition held recently at Bucknell University.

Team and individual winners were determined through a written examination given at Bucknell in Lewisburg. David Bader, William Brewster and Neil Szanyi comprised the Liberty team from the Bethlehem Area School District. Second place went to Lewisburg Area High School and third to Williamsport Area High.

Among the individual winners were Brewster, first place, and Szanyi, third. Bader earned an honorable mention. Brewster also received a book and certificate of recognition given to the highest ranking individual in each school.

Twenty-seven schools vied for honors in the competition sponsored by the Pennsylvania Beta Chapter of Pi Mu Epsilon, the national honorary mathematics society. Gold taught at Bucknell for nearly 50 years. The contest was established in his name to encourage mathematical talent.

Liberty also took honors for the second year in a row at the 12th annual S. Manford Lloyd mathematics contest held recently at Mansfield University. More than 100 students from 21 high schools participated.

Winning the \$100 first prize was senior William Brewster. Third prize of \$50 was awarded to Haiwen Ma, a junior at Liberty.

Liberty took first prize in the team competition and received an engraved plaque. Top scorer in each school received a medallion.
